The Foundation Level Training will help you become more aware of Lean concepts, why it's important to Lehigh, and how Lean is applicable to all operations regardless of stem. Effectively applying Lean will result in increased employee and customer satisfaction, hard and soft savings, increased productivity, process efficiency and support sustainability.

Virtual Binder: A Toolbox in the Digital Age Presented by Emily Ford, Emily Enters-Dake, Christina Jordan and Lisa Keller, College of Business Advisors

As higher education professionals, it is incumbent upon us to execute all of the intricacies of policies, procedures, and changing curricula to hundreds of students. This has become increasingly more difficult in our remote age; thus flexibility and innovation are required to maintain quality administration. In this presentation, we will provide context for the need for a Virtual Binder, show the Virtual Binder we have created, explain the steps we took to create it, and articulate how we used it to remotely onboard a new academic advisor. We will wrap up our presentation by discussing the multitude of applications and uses for such a versatile tool. From this presentation participants will be able to: (1) Understand how to use creativity and adaptability skill sets in their everyday work, regardless of their departmental infrastructure; (2) Consolidate and disseminate nuanced information and resources more efficiently, effectively, and sustainably within a team, remotely or in-person; and (3) Successfully onboard and retain a new employee in a digital age. Learn our story, the benefits we appreciate most, and how to apply this to your office or institution.

Gender, COVID-19 and 'Zines

University Data Resources Available from the Office of Institutional Research and Strategic Analytics Presented by Wyntre Stout, Research Analyst, Zane L. Kratzer, Data Research Scientist and Casey Petroski, Data Governance Manager, Office of Institutional Research and Strategic Analytics

The Office of Institutional Research and Strategic Analytics (OIRSA) is the source of comprehensive information regarding Lehigh University. Part of the Provost's stem, our mission is to collect and disseminate reliable and valid institutional data in a responsive, timely and ethical manner. In this session, we will provide an overview of some of the university data resources that OIRSA provides, including: (1) a wide variety of data products aimed at supporting the needs of faculty and staff for reporting and planning purposes, (2) surveys that provide insight into students' experience (e.g., First Year Survey, Senior Survey, National Survey of Student Engagement) as well as the experience of the broader Lehigh Community (e.g., Climate Survey) that OIRSA oversees, and (3) the Data Cookbook, Lehigh's collaborative data dictionary that provides data definitions to strengthen our data governance process and our understanding of terminology. We will focus on resources currently on the OIRSA website as well as discuss the process for submitting requests for customized data tools and reports.

InfoReady Review (https://lehigh.infoready4.com/#) is an online application and review management tool. InfoReady has simplified the OVPR internal grants and limited submission processes, eliminated the need for most emails and phone calls, ensured timely, pre-deadline response by reviewers, improved the accuracy and competitiveness of proposals, and saved significant administrative time. InfoReady's capabilities extend far beyond proposal development, review, and submission. In fact, any process involving an application that needs to be reviewed and judged may benefit from InfoReady. Potential uses, for example, might include: • Summer study or summer travel grant applications • Student poster competitions • Recognition nominations and awards • Internal scholarship and fellowship competitions • Event sign-ups • Conference and travel approval • Internal routing of proposals and approval
